LET'S GO GUAM: From boardroom to grassroots, Josh & Tina continue to build momentum

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With another commanding performance at a gubernatorial forum and high-energy village meeting, Josh Tenorio and Tina Muña-Barnes continue to grow support for their vision to build an island that offers the best place for residents to raise a family and plant their roots.

"The Governor of Guam needs to represent everyone on this island. In our administration, the grandpa in the back kitchen will have the same place at our table as the executive in the boardroom," Tenorio said.

Several members of the Guam Chamber of Commerce, which hosted Thursday's forum, were impressed with Tenorio's command of the issues and Muña-Barnes' passion to serve our people. Meanwhile, the team's vision for tackling the island's affordability crisis took center stage during their campaign's latest meet and greet held later that evening in Yona.

"My home may be in Pago Bay, but my heart has been in Yona for many, many years. My oldest brother lived here. And for me, this village proves that when you focus on families — when you keep schools and churches and hometown programs strong — our people can reach their dreams," Muña-Barnes said.

Yona Mayor BJ Terlaje, one of 14 village mayors endorsing the Tenorio Muña-Barnes team shared that, like many of his colleagues, he has seen the transformational results from the Lieutenant Governor's investments into his community. For Yona, these include completed and ongoing improvements to its community center, restoration of baseball fields and Tagachang beach, and enhancements to village-based senior programs.

"Leadership is measured not only by promises made, but by results delivered," Mayor Terlaje told a crowd of more than 400 of his residents. "Over the past several years, our community of Yona has witnessed meaningful investments, tangible improvements, and a level of attention that has addressed both long-standing challenges and future opportunities for our families."

"At today's forum, I told the Chamber that our very first executive budget will include investments into housing, to give subsidies for first-time homeowners and tax incentives to companies who build affordable homes," Tenorio said. "That's going to be a big help for the young parents who are coming up in the workforce. There's a noticeable generational change happening in the private sector, and I'm telling the people of Guam that this same shift to the next generation of leadership, with fresh ideas and energy, will happen in our administration."

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
